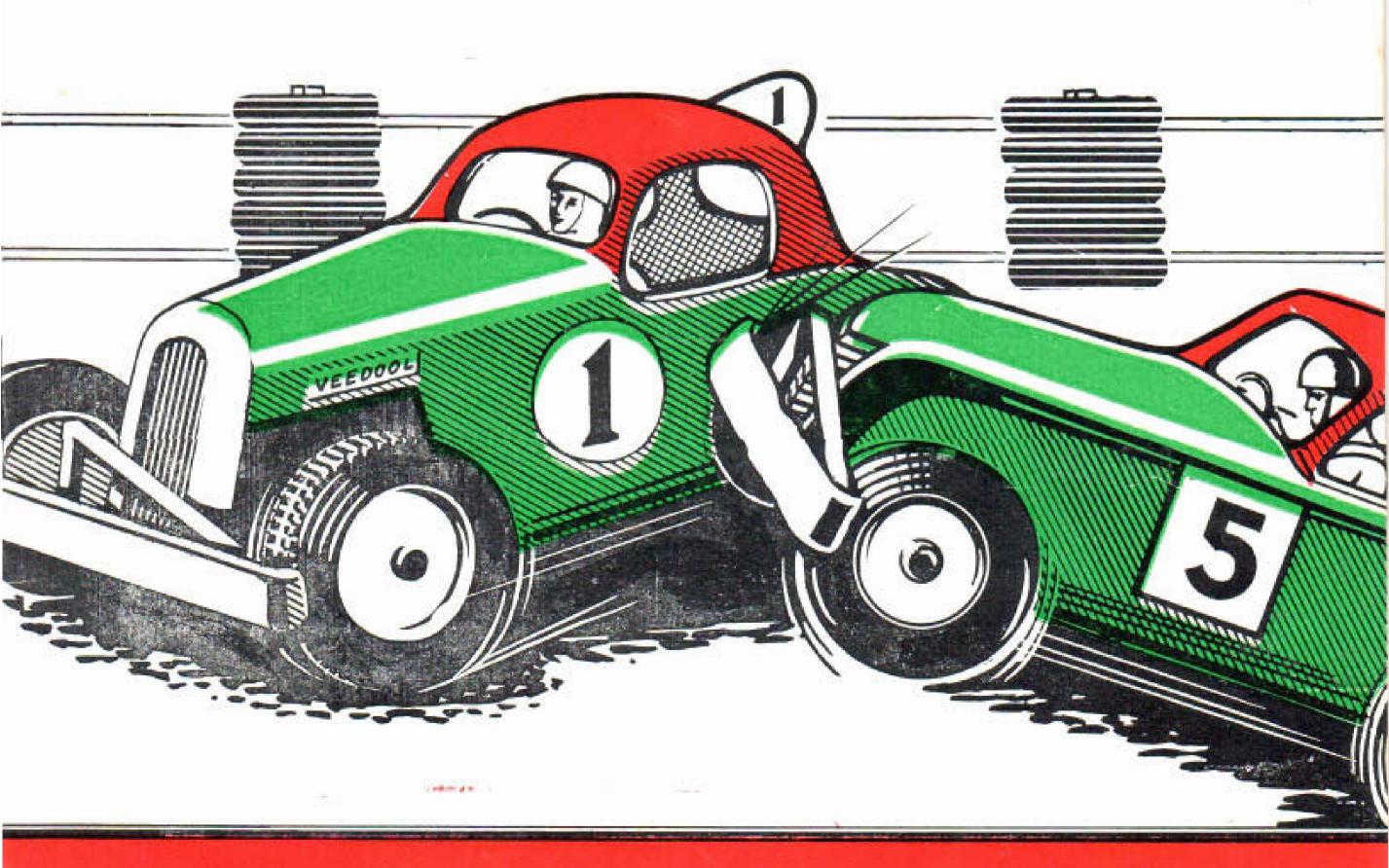

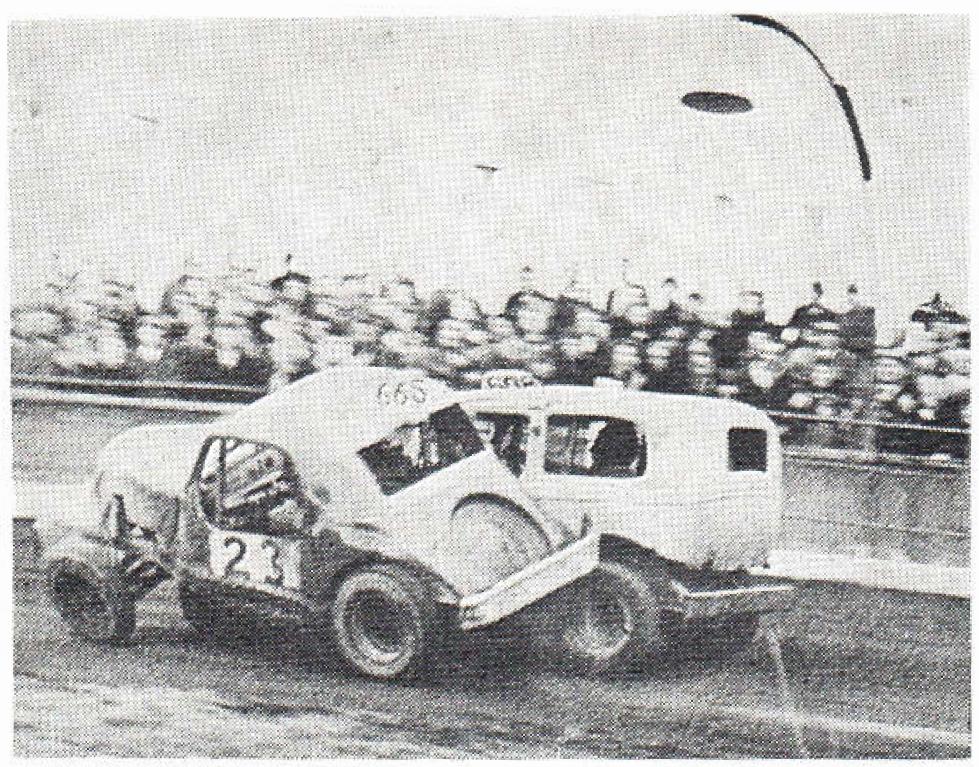

SIGNALS IN USE AT THIS MEETING

The Green Flag is dropped at the starting line when the race is on. During the race it signifies that the course is clear. The Yellow Flag warns drivers to use caution but not to change positions. It is used when "Wide open" driving is not permitted. The Red Flag is used to denote that the race has been stopped, and the Black Flag to order a car back to the pits. The Chequered Flag indicates the end of a race.

Lights:

Green — Go; Amber—Caution; Red — Stop.

THEY ALL WANT TO RACE HERE

SAYS PETER ARNOLD

THE fame of this circuit is spreading — fast. The two meetings so far held have attracted very good entries — and by that I mean a plentiful number to make racing interesting, and of a high enough category to make it competitive. This, of course, pleases you, the spectators. It also satisfied the two promoters, because their aim has been right from the start to provide nothing but the best. So what am I getting at? . . . let me tell you.

As I'm sure you will appreciate, every promoter of sporting presentations such as this aim to work to a budget (signs of Mr. Callaghan!). Costs of promoting are not low. Promoting is something of a gamble anyway, and on top of this, the expenses must be married to the possible income and returns. The money you, the spectator, pay decrees how much can be spent, and still leave a little for profit—or a rainy day! That much is all understandable.

There is also a limit as to how many cars (and drivers) can be accommodated in any programme of events, however generous a promoter may wish to be. For instance, it's doubtful if more people would come if there were, say, 100 competitors. You can have too many cars in a race — the damage rate is high (which may mean that incidents abounded) and in the end, subsequent races suffer. And in modern day Stock Car Racing, the emphasis is on RACING and not simply 'bash and destroy' as it might once have been. The followers of the sport have often indicated in letters to my magazine and in pits chats that they like to see incidents, but also enjoy the real racing aspect; the cut and thrust of races like our first final won by Dick Sworder, and like the final at our last meeting won by Johnnie Allen. There's something quite exciting about such a spectacle.

The embarrassment of having too many drivers wanting to compete here is one now facing 'Chick' and 'Doug'. They have to strike a happy balance, and provide outings for competitors in all of the four grades. This is logic — and fair. They also have a budget to work to. And the two are more than ever related, one with the other, now that 'appearance' money is based on grading, the higher grades getting more 'start' money. So grades, too, now have to be balanced with an eye to finance. Hence the present predicament.

The two 'W's have tried to be fair, and to strike a balanced programme, and at the same time present you, the paying public, with the drivers you want to see, drivers who they know will put on a show. It's not a task I envy them. You can appreciate the point if I tell you that there are, at present, some 18 'stars' in the Formula II section — and ALL OF THEM want to race here!

They may well be given the opportunity later in the season at a special 'all-star' trophy meeting, for I know such plans are afoot, and for which already the promoters have acquired a magnificent trophy. I'll be telling you more about that — and the meeting, in later 'chats' in this column.

So tonight we come to the third meeting—and its back in the afternoon again. The main object of the 'exercise' is the 'Stadium Trophy' kindly presented by the stadium management, speedway promoters Maurice Littlechild and Cyril Crane — to whom many thanks. I've seen the entry list and it looks quite exciting, with previous final winners and placemen featured together with some new faces. Incidentally, it's good to hear that already this venue has attracted some more local lads to try their hand, and we'll doubtless be seeing them too, when they have built or acquired cars.

Incidentally, may I bring to your attention the two best ways of keeping in touch with what is happening in the sport elsewhere — the monthly 'Stock Car Racing News' (new edition with reports of our two previous meetings, on sale today), and the new weekly motoring newspaper (out on Thursdays) called 'Auto News,' which carries a regular Stock Car column and pictures. Both worthy of your attention.

And so to the racing. Cars have been Scrutineered, mechanics have checked the petrol, oil and water, and drivers have strapped themselves into their seats. Everyone is ready . . . Starter Gerry Weir raises his flag . . . and they're off.
