

have the impression that it is not now being too well served by its officials, and I lay the blame for this right on the doorstep of a Joint Committee meeting of two years ago which stated that the Promoters should appoint the Stewards. This is entirely wrong; When I was an official Steward, I had as many arguments with the promoters — Geoff Barnett or John La Trobe will bear this out — as I did with drivers. But now I feel I should have a far more difficult task. One promoter said that he would not place his meetings in the hands of a Steward, who might order the restarting of a race if he was not satisfied; he voiced this view, he said, on behalf of his patrons who would become restive if the racing was delayed thus. From the letters which Peter Arnold and myself receive, I feel that the patrons would be well pleased if the Stewards took a firmer line and stopped the higher grades from filtering forward.

As I am so bitterly opposed to this view, Brafield has not appointed a Steward. If the Board would send us one, I should be happy to see that he was properly accommodated and that his instructions were carried out, just as, in my own stewarding days, Brafield always carried out what I decreed, I know that no rules are broken in our presentation of the sport, and, on the occasion, so far, when rules have been broken, I have reported them myself. I hope the Board will read this, and, for that matter, that Peter Arnold will read it, because I notice that he has mentioned, with a little tinge of distate, 'tracks at which no Steward is appointed'. Now he and everybody will know why there is not one here. Apart from me...
