

SIGNALS IN USE AT THIS MEETING

The Green Flag is dropped at the starting line when the race is on. During the race it signifies that the course is clear. The Yellow Flag warns drivers to use caution but not to change positions. It is used when "Wide open" driving is not permitted, the Union Jack denotes the race has passed the half-way stage. The Red Flag is used to denote that the race has been stopped, and the Black Flag to order a car back to the pits. The Chequered Flag indicates the end of a race.

Lights: Green — Go: Amber — Caution: Red — Stop.

HALLO

YOU can't say we don't have incidents here at Saddle-bow Road. Our last meeting three weeks ago had enough one way or another. Take unlucky Eddie Asling, for instance. After getting tangled in the opening laps, and seemingly already in trouble inside his car, he was hit again by the passing traffic — and knocked out cold. The race had to be stopped. All that happened after Eddie had won his Match Race event with Roy Goodman and in the first heat. The next stoppage came in the Consolation when Pete Merries flipped over and was trapped. Pete had driven as well as he ever has to stay out in front of this usually hectic race. It seemed he might even get the chequered flag — but he must have got over-anxious, he got involved — and the race had to be stopped again. Like Eddie he suffered little personal damage — thankfully. And he'll be back again this afternoon — like Eddie, for another try to win.

Man of the meeting was Tony Allen from Luton. He qualified in the Consolation with a third place, and then drove immaculately to win the final and the 'Stars' Trophy. He is having a great season — his best since he switched from the Seniors. In fact Tony packed up Seniors and concentrated on his business interests and his family. But the lure was too strong and he came bouncing back — with much success. He's been in form at other circuits too, winning finals at Ringwood, Brafield and Rayleigh.

His success brings an interesting 'double', for this afternoon he challenges Eddie Asling for the Match Race title. Nothing unusual in that, you might say. Every final winner takes a tilt at the Match Race title in the next meeting. Fair enough. But the curious thing is that last night, at Rayleigh, these two were racing against each other for the Rayleigh Match Race title. Only last night, having beaten holder Asling in the previous meeting, Allen was racing against the winner of the previous meeting's final — yes, you guessed — Eddie Asling! So by the time they meet today they should know each others tactics pretty well. And the race, what ever happened last night, will be a revenge chance for one of them.

For some time now we have been toying with the idea of introducing Formula I cars to Saddlebow Road. Today we have taken the step. We have invited two local drivers, both in the 'A' Grade Blue Top section — Tony Wicks from Wisbech, and our starter, Gerry Weir, from Ipswich. This little experiment will be an interesting guide to us. It will show if the track is suitable; if the surface is ideal and if the track is wide enough.
