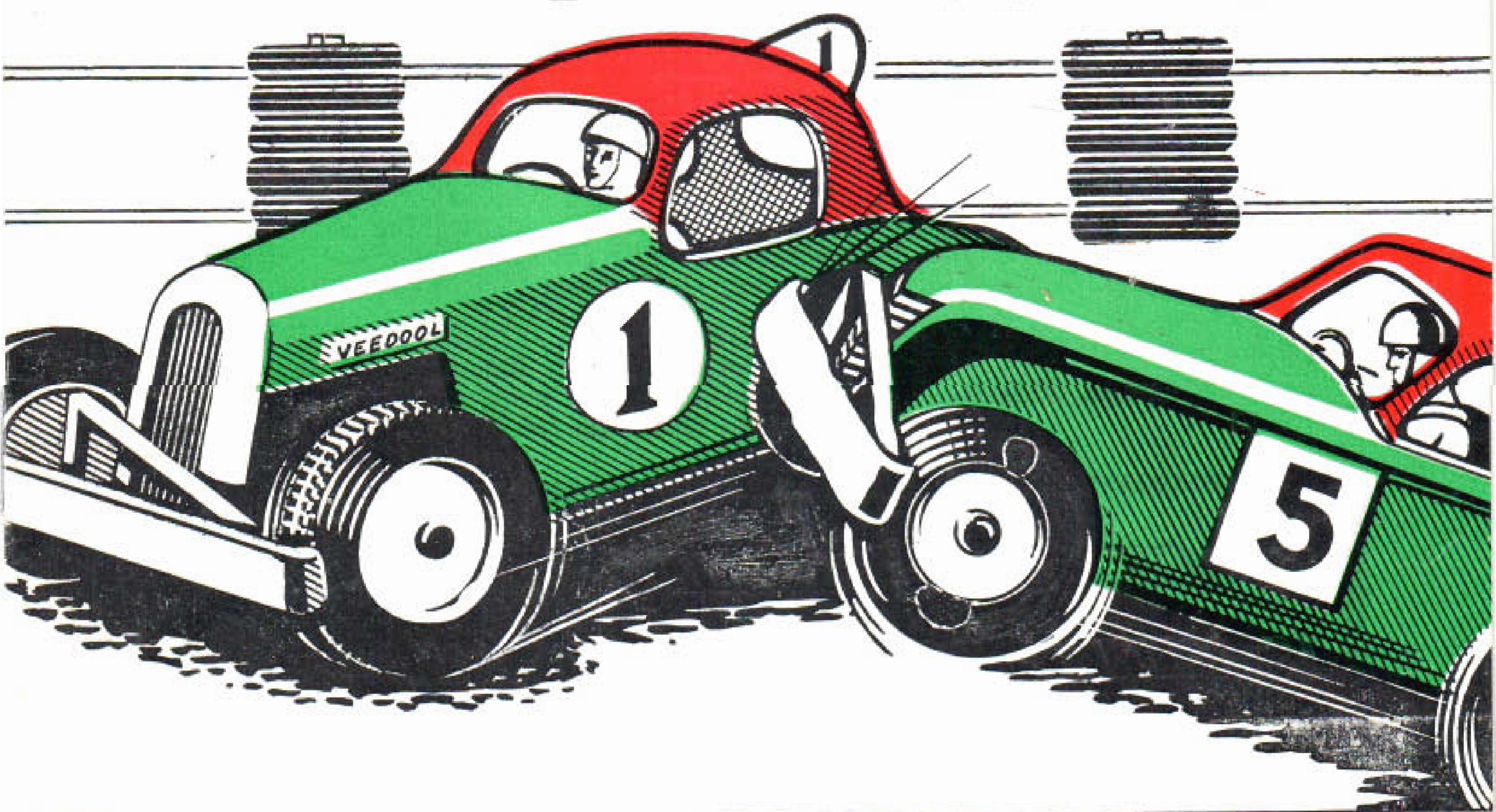

SIGNALS IN USE AT THIS MEETING

The **Green Flag** is dropped at the starting line when the race is on. During the race it signifies that the course is clear. The **Yellow Flag** warns drivers to use caution but not to change positions. It is used when "Wide open" driving is not permitted. the **Union Jack** denotes the race has passed the half-way stage. The **Red Flag** is used to denote that the race has been stopped, and the **Black Flag** to order a car back to the pits. The **Chequered Flag** indicates the end of a race.

Lights: Green — Go; Amber — Caution; Red — Stop.

Pete had driven as well as he ever has to stay out in front of this usually hectic race. It seemed he might even get the chequered flag — but he must have got over-anxious, he got involved — and the race had to be stopped again. Like Eddie he suffered little personal damage — thankfully. And he'll be back again this afternoon — like Eddie, for another try to win.

Man of the meeting was Tony Allen from Luton. He qualified in the Consolation with a third place, and then drove immaculately to win the final and the 'Stars' Trophy. He is having a great season — his best since he switched from the Seniors. In fact Tony packed up Seniors and concentrated on his business interests and his family. But the lure was too strong and he came bouncing back — with much success. He's been in form at other circuits too, winning finals at Ringwood, Brafield and Rayleigh.

His success brings an interesting 'double', for this afternoon he challenges Eddie Asling for the Match Race title. Nothing unusual in that, you might say. Every final winner takes a tilt at the Match Race title in the next meeting. Fair enough. But the curious thing is that last night, at Rayleigh, these two were racing against each other for the Rayleigh Match Race title. Only last night, having beaten holder Asling in the previous meeting, Allen was racing against the winner of the previous meeting's final — yes, you guessed — Eddie Asling! So by the time they meet today they should know each others tactics pretty well. And the race, what ever happened last night, will be a revenge chance for one of them.
