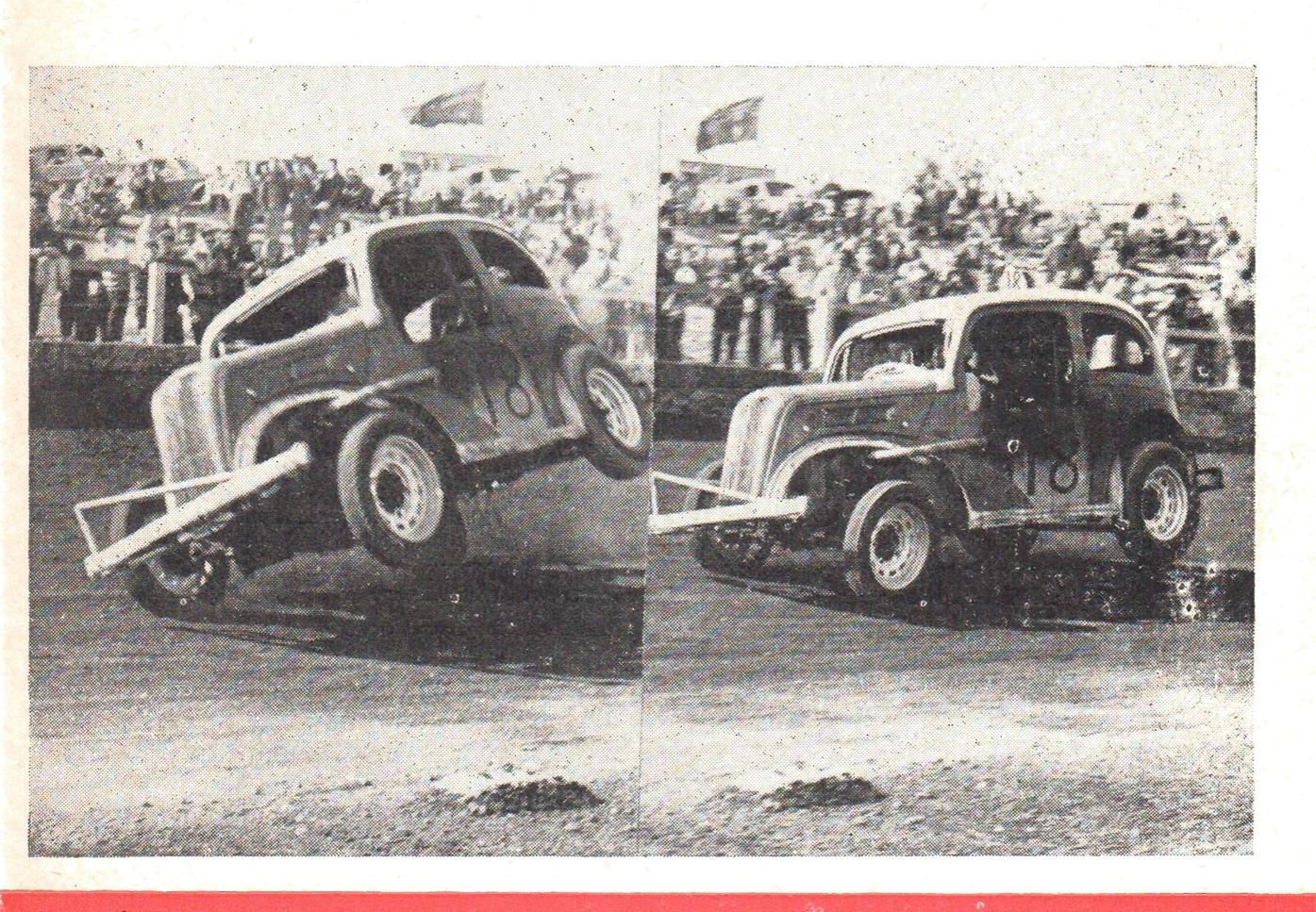

FLASHING AMBER: Competitors to race with extreme caution and do not change race positions.

RED FLAG: Denotes that the Race has been stopped.

YELLOW FLAG: Drivers must use caution and must not change positions. BLACK FLAG: Denotes driver has been disqualified and must withdraw from race immediately.

CHEQUERED FLAG: Denotes driver has completed the required number of laps.

CHEQUERED & RED FLAGS TOGETHER: Denotes that race is completed.

A wolf in sheep's clothing—that's about the best way I can describe the Hot Rod—an entirely new power unit that is fast making its mark

on Britain's motor racing scene.

Certainly from a distance it's hard to distinguish a Hot Rod from a normal production car. Closer inspection reveals unusual safety precautions—no glass, sturdy roll bars, aircraft-type safety harnesses. But for a real surprise look under the bonnet, see just how to house a powerful engine such as an M.G. 1600 or a Cortina 'G.T.' engine in a Minor or Ford 8 body.

Hot Rods, like the one above driven by Raceway track manager Larry Wetton, look despairingly innocent as they glide on to the track,

but when the racing starts look out for speed and skill.

Already Hot Rods are causing excited comment in motoring circles, and all the drivers here tonight are members of the recently-formed Midland Hot Rod Club. The beauty of this type of motor sport is that it's within the reach of almost everyone's pocket—the fantastic 00 (Double Zero), driven by 17-year-old Martin Morris, cost only £130 to build and that includes a £70 engine—and it combines safety with speed.

Also on tonight's bill of fare are leaping lightweight stock cars—

and mustard motor cycle sidecar men!

7	E SPECTATO	R'S COLUMN

By DON ROUND (the "Happy Spectator.")

Well, well!! Things are "swingin'." Mr. Morris and myself have at last received letters (from far and near) in response to my continued pleas, and so today this column is devoted, as was intended, mainly to spectators. On top of this we spectators have had the pleasure of three Hednesford meetings within 14 days.

The first two letters arrived the day after the programmes for August 5th and 10th had gone to the printers and were from a "Local Spectator" of Cannock Wood who feels more local advertising would increase the attendances and W. Day, of Chesterfield, who thinks the way the Twilight Derby is run is a farce. Since then we have received more from W. G. Heath, of Lichfield, who refers to Commentator Geoff Barnett as wicked; Mrs. Yvonne Brooks, of Chadderton, in Lancs., for the Manchester Midget Car Club, would like to see a "speed limit" imposed on officials' and competitors' vehicles outside the track; Dave Earp and mates, of Wolverhampton, favour Stox and Hot Rods but deplore Motor Cycle outfits and Midgets; Mr. and Mrs. Arrowsmith, of Shimal in Salop, advocate flag marshalls because of the accidents on August Monday (they were particularly concerned about the injured first aid man-who wasn't?) but they are still keen enough to consider organising a coach trip from their home town; B. de Bell, of Northampton, made his first visit on August 10th and showers us with praise and promises to come as often as possible next season; Mr. and Mrs. Bourne, of Wednebury, in Staffs., have the same feelings as B. de Bell and suggests an all-in admission charge including car parking and perhaps the programme; and finally Mr. Nigel Bill offers his Company's help with regard to printing the programmes and car stickers. Obviously to all the above mentioned people we are very grateful for their efforts, but due to lack of space I cannot go into detail on their comments. However, Mr. Morris and myself have replied to the above personally. The most important point from all the letters received is that everyone enjoyed what they saw at Hednesford Hills Raceway except that one or two of you dislike the "bitsy" set up at Hot Rod Cavalcades.

Senior Stox are definately the favourite presentation it appears, but I must point out that the "Seniors" have taken 10 years to reach the standard we see

today.

Unfortunately the number of Hot Rods race-ready is way below the number anticipated and so to put on a show for us, Mr. Morris has had to include the Midgets (also in the process of building up their sport); Motor Cycle Chairs who are always in short supply, due to so many other A.C.U. meetings, and Junior Stock Car "Stars" and "A Graders" are snapped up by promoters who have been established for a number of seasons. As far as staging a full Senior or Junior meeting on Bank Holidays is concerned, at the moment Mr. Morris is tail-end-Charlie in the eyes of these Long Established Tracks and the Board of Control. Even on Saturday nights (the most popular race time) at least one or two other tracks have fixtures and the fact of the matter is that there are just not enough drivers to meet the demand.

The answer of course would be Sunday afternoon meetings as there is only Brafield with fortnightly meetings at the moment and so the drivers would welcome another Sunday track. The Stox Board of Control would also be very pleased

as it would ease their congested Saturday fixture list.

Tonight, for instance, there are meetings at Belle Vue, West Ham and Norwich, but nevertheless we shall see a couple of Junior Stox Heats in addition to the Cavalcade of Hot Rods (at least 12 this time) and Motor Cycle Chairs which if nothing else provide "Blood" for those people so inclined—and believe me some of you feel that way (I have letters to prove it). I have actually spoken to some of these M/C lads who risk THEIR necks to entertain US and my

comments to them were—"rather you than me, mates."

I would like to now place another couple of feathers in Mr. Morris' cap:

(a) for putting on a pretty good show with the H.R. Cavalcade on August Monday in spite of difficulties, and for achieving a presentation of trophies by "Senior Service" cigarettes—a break through indeed; (b) for organising such a fabulous "Senior" Stox Meeting on August 10th (only five days later) for the H.H.R. "Driver of the Year" Trophy. Although this was the "latest" meeting, it was also the "fastest." Ellis (3) and Jumbo Tustin (179) both broke the 1 lap record at a speed of 54.26 m.p.h. and Al Griffin (178) the 25 lap record at an average of 43.95 m.p.h. Talking of feathers! "How tickled I am" myself because through this column I have forecast Senior Stox speeds of nearly 55 m.p.h. and also devil-may-care Al Griffin would be on the verge of a Red Roof—by winning his heat and final on the 10th he now progresses to a Blue Top. I hear Freddie Mitchell, the world champion, was there too—did you see him? . . . Sorry, folks, he came in 5t'r.

Whilst on the subject of records, it is intersting to note that at August Monday's Hot Rod Cavalcade, Martin Morris in "Double Zero" broke his own I lap record with a speed of 44.55 m.p.h. and also of course he and the other Hot Rod boys now have an 8 lap record to attack tonight which stands at 41.67 m.p.h. average compared with the fastest Junior Stox records of 44.12 m.p.h. for

1 lap and 38.79 m.p.h. average for 10 laps.

Incidentally the long awaited No. H.131 of Senior Stox driver Doug Warners built in Co. with ex-racing driver Bert Field, will be battling it out with "Double Zero" tonight—this I would like to see but your "Happy Spectator" will be on his "Hols.," however I HOPE TO BE BACK in time for the Production Car Meeting on September 7th.
