In the Junior final, he came up behind Bruce Laurie, who was racing stock cars here before Chick came into the game, and was pleased to see Bruce pull over to let him through on the inside. His pleasure turned to dismay when he discovered that he had fallen for the oldest trick in the sport, for Bruce returned to his inside line and Chick swooped up and over on the barrels! It reminded me of the time when George Radwan did the same thing to Vic Ferriday twice in one race at Brandon!

We have all three Laurie brothers—they come from Byfield, by Rugby, by the way—here today, and we note with interest that Bob has built himself a 'special' based on Austin commercial chassis—two of 'em—an A.30 body (incomplete) and a 348 cubic-inch Chevrolet Impala engine. This sounds very potent to me. Let's hope it stays together! Although Bob agrees with me about the stupidity of the new weight-limit, he has obeyed the rules and the car weighs only $26\frac{1}{4}$ cwt.
