So another annual "Miss Brafield" contest has been and gone, leaving behind another of the season's milestones. The next contest will be next Whitsun, if you want to start persuading your girl-friends, gentlemen!

One or two people commented that they thought it took too long. Well, that's as may be. If this were a theatre, it would be merely a matter of having the young ladies on the stage, in full view of everybody at once; but here, we have to show our entries around a quarter of a mile of track, and that's where the time is taken. FUTURE EVENTS

Our next meeting is in three weeks' time, when we have the all-Senior first round of the World Championship. As you know, the rules of this competition require me to invite all the top-grade drivers first, which should ensure a very good meeting for those who like their racing fast. In the past we have run the first qualifying round of the season and the last, but this year we are about central. This may well mean that the drivers who have got lots of points are still trying to get more, and that those who have been unlucky will still be trying to get somewhere in the placings. And, of course, those who have got a middling sort of tally, will be trying to get up among the high scorers, so we've got it all ways.

The South Midland Championship takes place on July 12th, and this will be a mixed meeting, for Senior and Junior drivers from Northants., Warwickshire, Hertfordshire, Buckinghamshire, Bedfordshire, Oxfordshire, and Cambridgeshire only. The Championship will be in two classes and both final winners will receive suitable trophies. This is a change from the published fixture list, which showed this meeting as a Senior Restricted, but so popular has the mixed-meeting formula proved, that we are making this change.

Im am giving thought to what I may call a "Mixed Fours" contest for Junior cars. This may take place instead of the Midland Junior Champion-ship, but I shall let you know, as soon as I have decided whether to run it as ten shortish races or five longer ones. The prize money schedule will also make for interesting mathematics, in order that the whole thing is as fair as possible.

SOUND EQUIPMENT

Once again we are experimenting, this time with a different contractor and we hope to get it right soon. With the exception of the day when I did the commentary, however, we have not yet been so bad as some of the permanent installations at far prouder stadiums.
