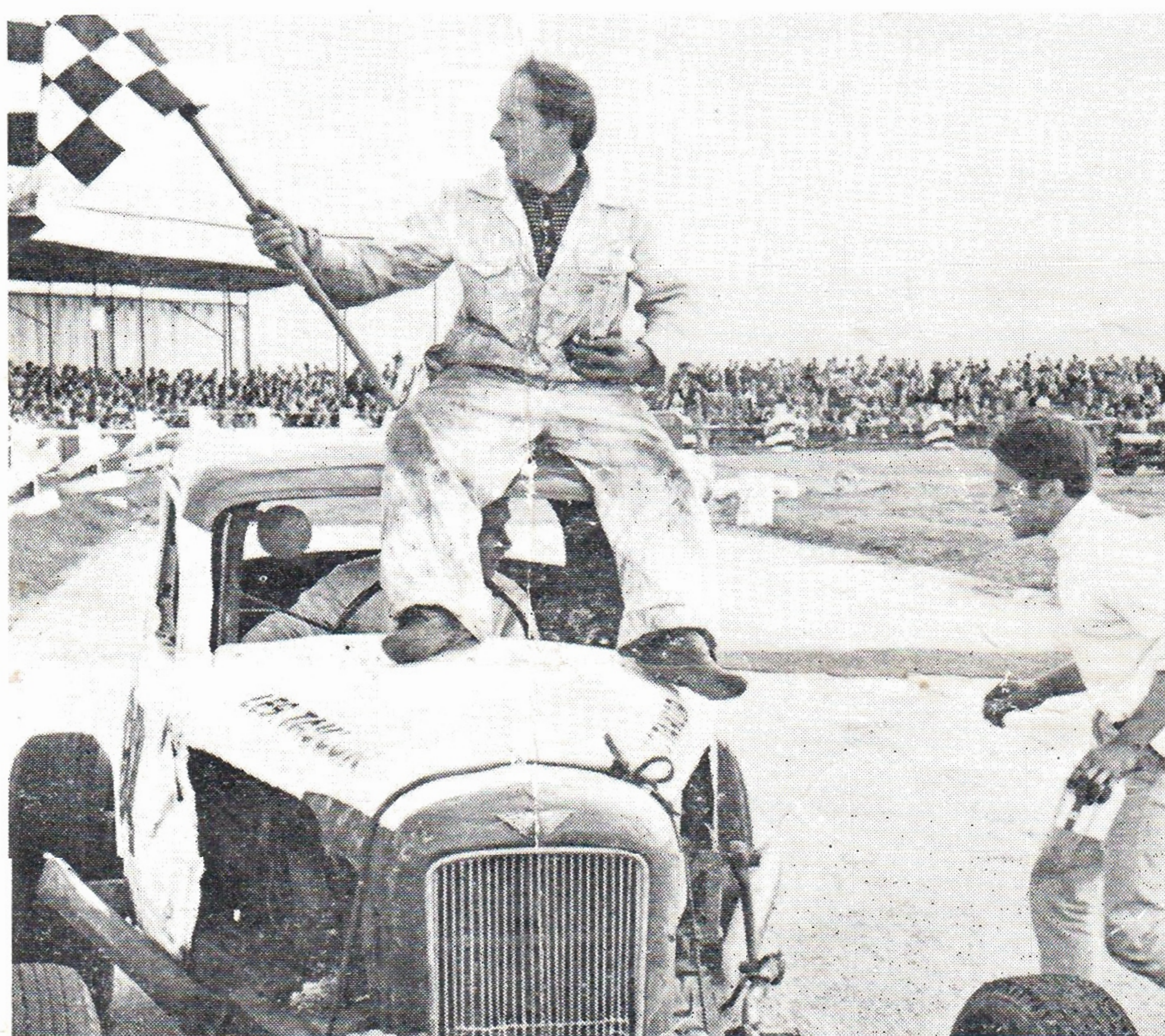

GRAHAM'S GOING WEST

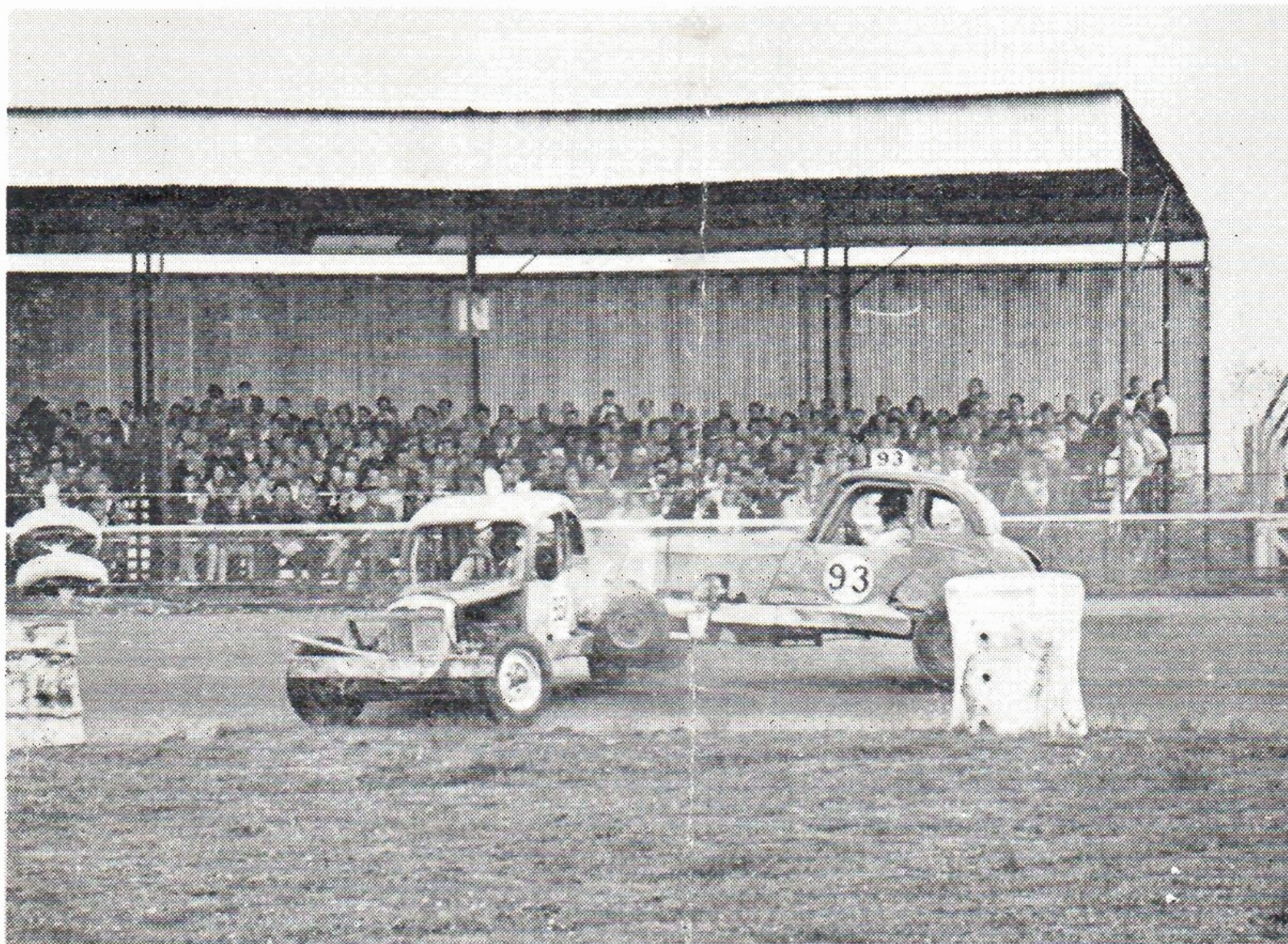

Our next meeting is a semi-final for the World Championship, and will be held here on August 29th, with all the top Junior drivers. Don't miss it.

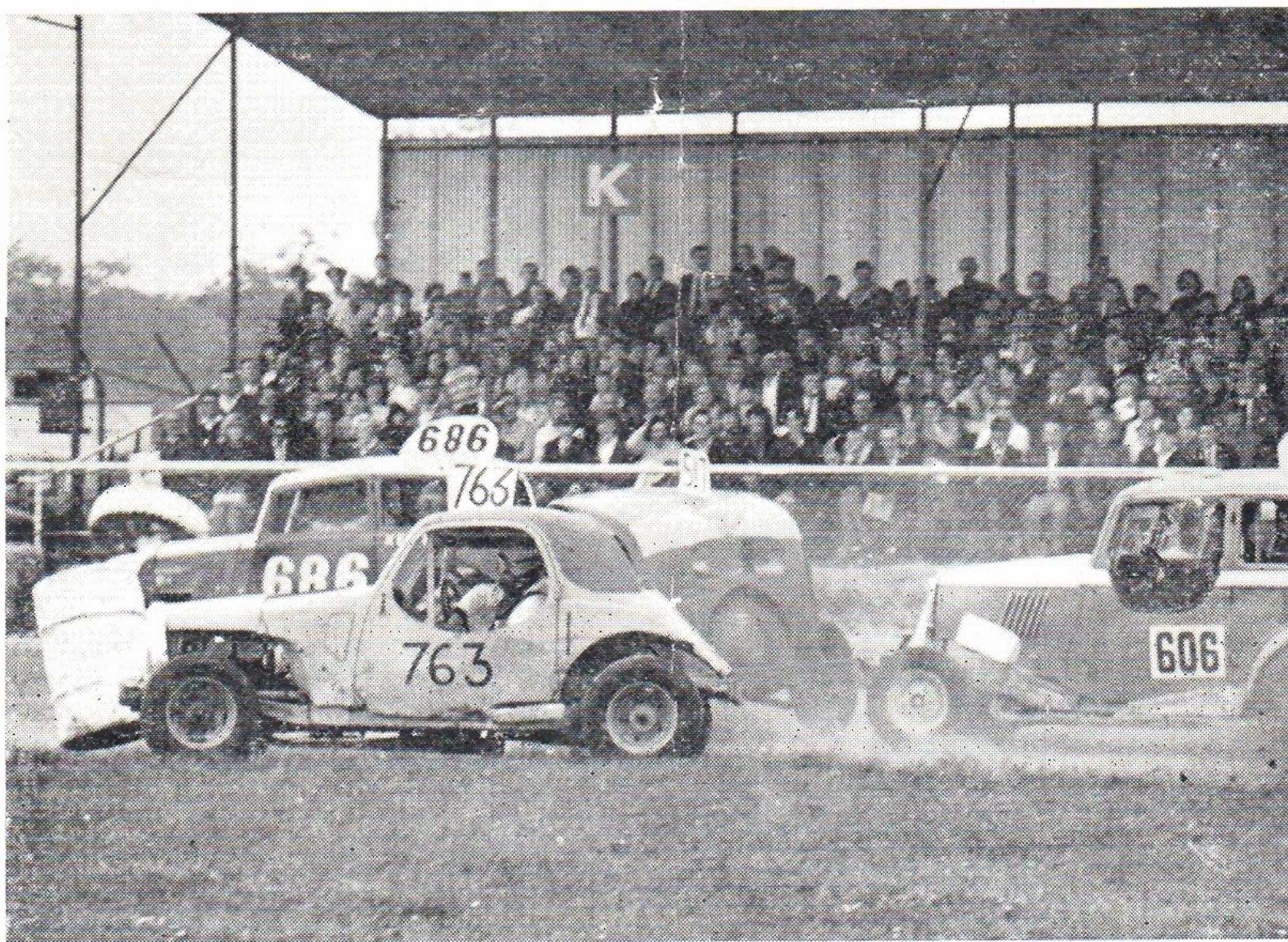
