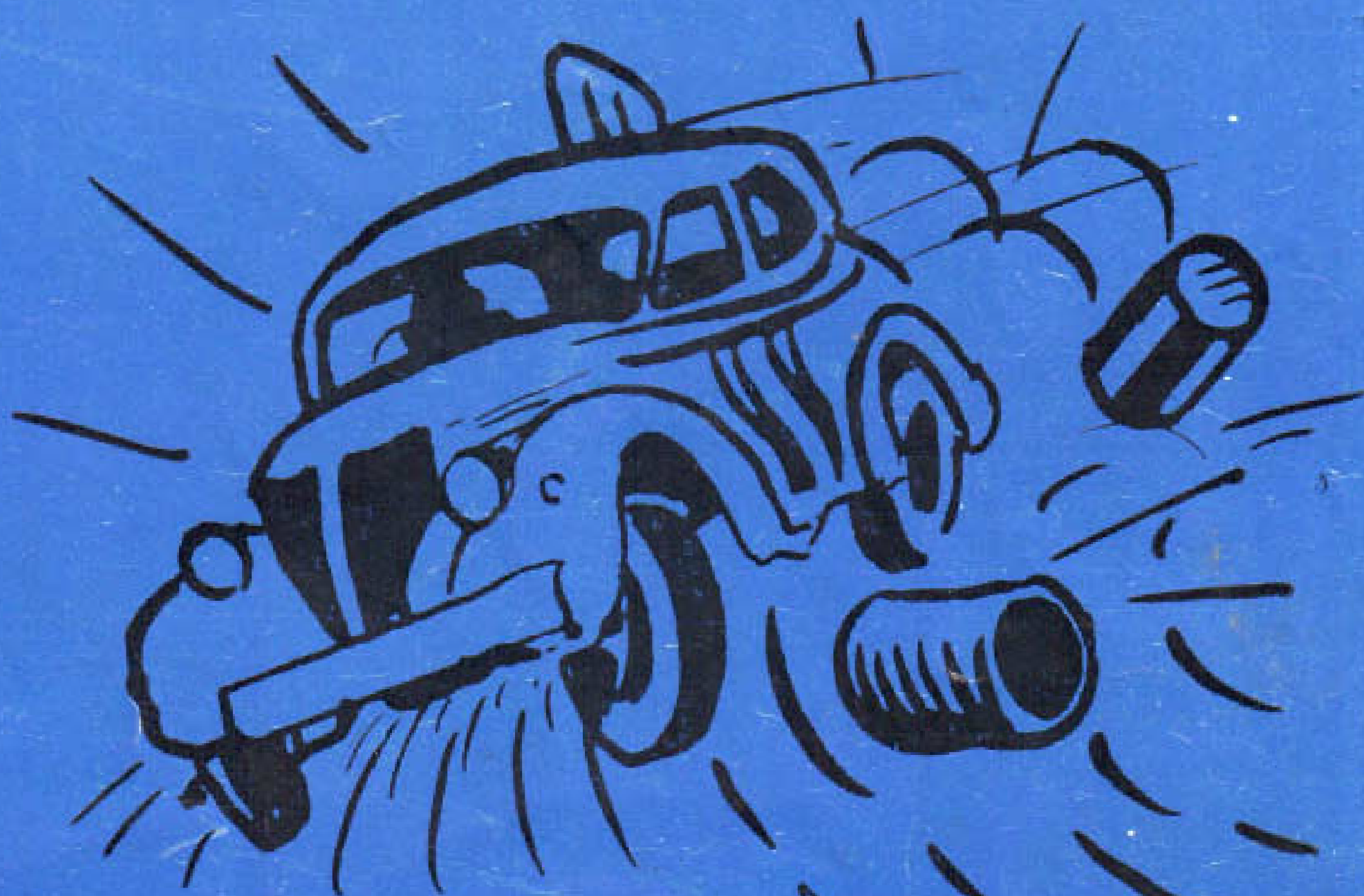

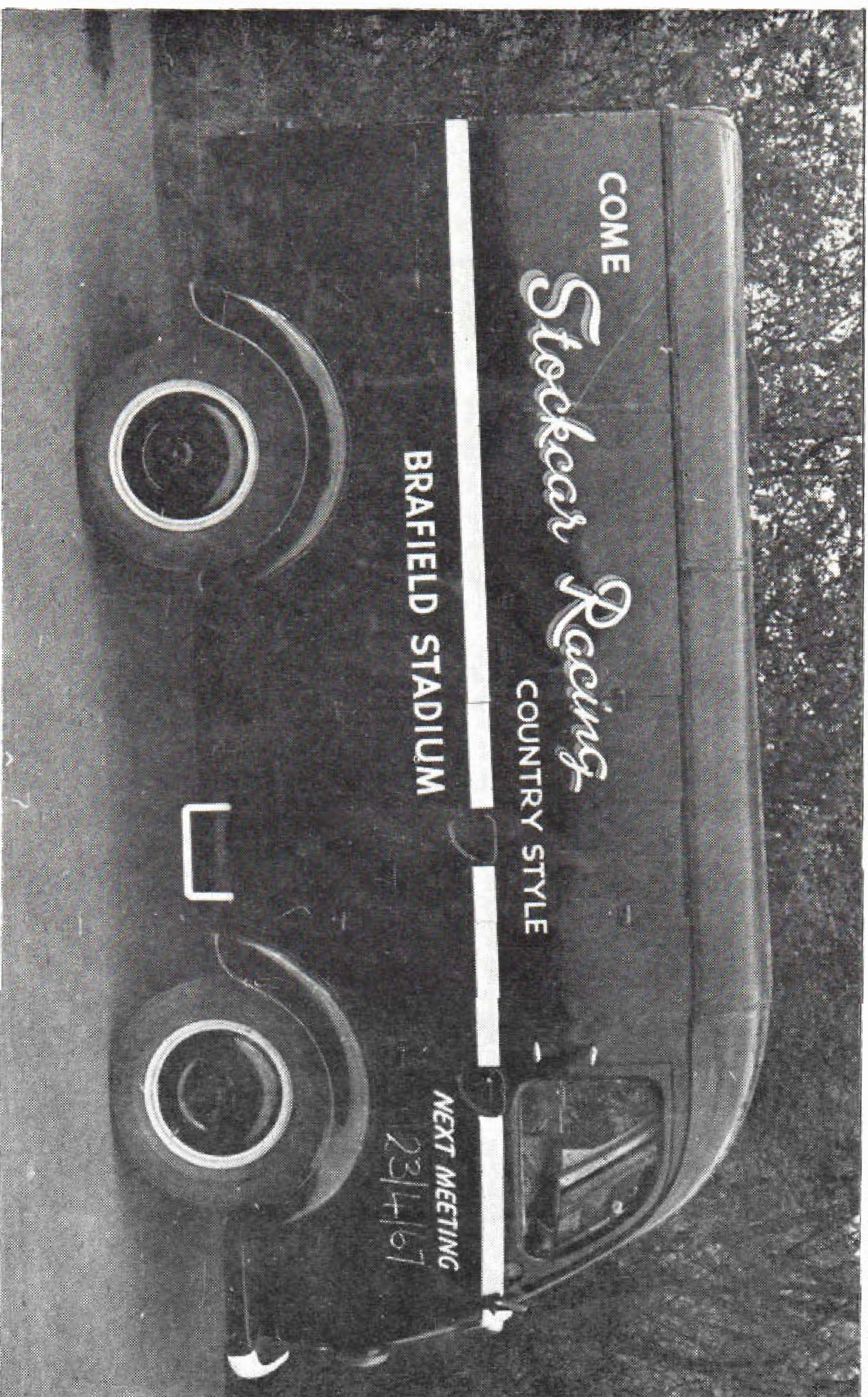

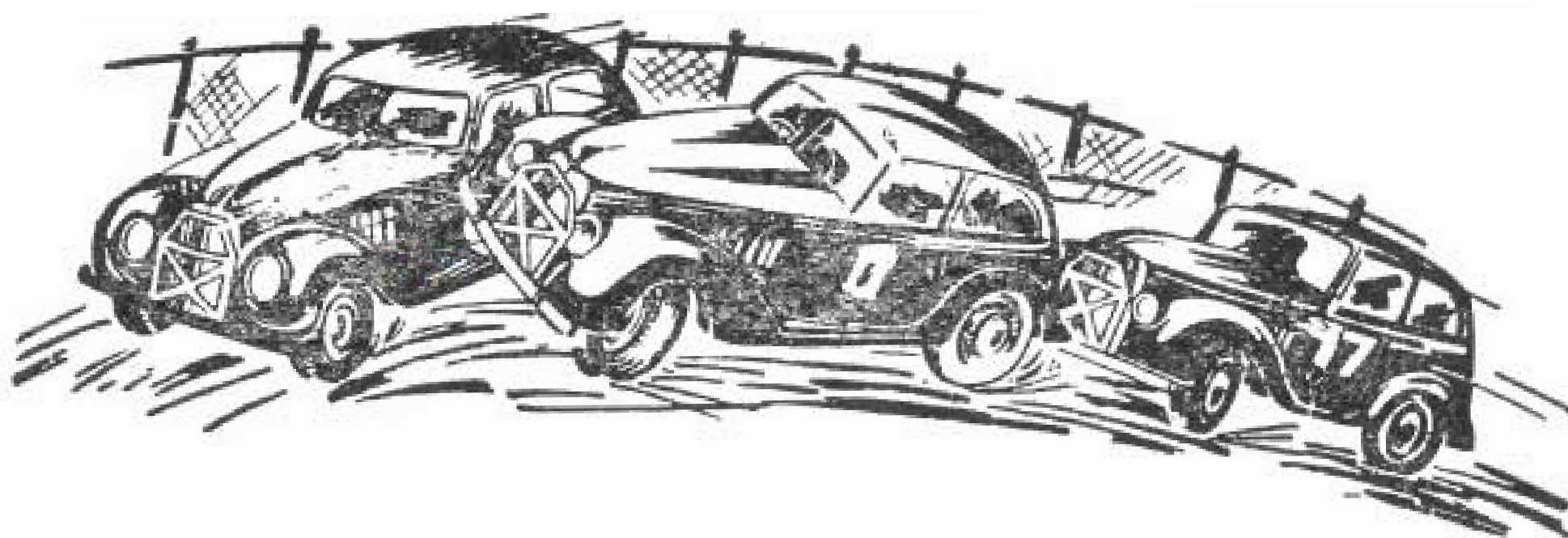

JULY THE NINTH
