



# ROUND THE BENDS

#### WELCOME HOME

With fingers firmly crossed and hoping like anything for a fine day, here I am writing the first of our 1967 columns. To all you faithful Brafield supporters I should like to say "Welcome Home", and to those new to us, may I say just "Welcome". It is nice to be back in action, although as you can imagine, the past few weeks have been extremely lively, with the preparations and arrangements for this season all occupying time, and then of course—you know me—there is always the last minute rush to do the things that I have forgotten to do.

Welcome, then, to all of you and let us have a great day's racing.

#### THE WINTER

I thought hard before I started this paragraph; should I write it at all, and risk casting an air of gloom over the proceedings, or should I record with true sorrow, and with sincere personal sadness, two deaths that have robbed the Stock Car racing world of two fine people.

Late October brought the death of Frank Howlett, a man who truly devoted his life to the sport. Giving up a lucrative business in commercial art, Frank threw himself into our sport with a bubbling enthusiasm and a zest that would have done credit to a man of half his years. Spurning sleep, working round the clock, Frank Howlett was an evangelist of stock car racing, and his converts must have numbered many thousands since 1954, when I first met him. It matters not that he was with the Spedeworth organisation now that he has gone; he was a one hundred per cent Stock Car Man, and the thousand-yard line of cars that followed the hearse to Aldershot Cemetery showed the regard which was felt for him.

With the end of the following month came the tragic news of the death of Mrs. FRIDA ARNOLD, well-beloved throughout the Stock Car fraternity. She had been ill for some time, and her passing was not a shock to those close to her, though it was still a terrible blow. Frida Arnold managed to achieve a status very rare in such a close-knit community as ours. She was universally liked, and, at the same time, universally respected. There cannot have been one person in that community who did not feel a sense of private, personal loss. We have lost a lap-scorer whose techniques was learnt direct from the Americans, and a friend who was known wherever the sport has been.

A little while after preparing the paragraph, I learned that Harry Andrews, who raced here regularly in the days of the Lambert clan, to whom he was related by marriage, collapsed and died just after completing his racing car for this season. One of the Lewisham boys, Harry was always a great trier, and we regret his passing.

#### WHAT ABOUT 1967?

Well, I know as much as you do about the prospects for this year and it never does to make forecasts.

One thing I do not like is the roughshod manner in which the "authorities" in charge of our sport have seen fit to change the numbers of a lot of star drivers. Early on, I had a circular from the British Stock Car Supporters Association, asking that this alteration be shelved; typically, however, the wishes of the most important people in the sport—the supporters—have been ignored, and we find that the Wardropper fans will have to rename themselves "The Fiver-Oh-Fivers" and that the Woodroffe organisation will have to explain how the words "Tip Top" and "Number 601" have anything to do with each other. Roy Goodman is now 800, and there are a lot more dam silly changes.

This is a piece of officialdom for officialdom's sake, and far from easing the lot of the lap-scorer, will make it more difficult, for the competent scorer scores on the overall combination of car and number, if you see what I mean. The lap-scorers will now have to learn all the numbers over again—and so shall I—and so will all the commentators. It looks as though somebody has either blundered or is trying to make the junior stock car scene as difficult as possible.

it is time that some of our "leaders" learnt a little common sense—which in sporting entertainment, means doing what the paying patrons like best. We have no desire to attain the respectability of county cricket if a similar financial status goes with it, but there are a few trying to force us that way.

And by the way, although I cannot go into details, there have been some funny goings-on with elections and so forth. In one election, a decision was reached by democratic methods, and when it was found that the result was not to the liking of the "Cabinet", one of its members offered to stand down to readmit his unsuccessful colleague. And they talk about Harold Wilson and his "dog-license" speech! Can you imagine Wilson offering to stand down to readmit Sir Alec Douglas-Home?

#### **NEW FACES GALORE**

I cannot possibly mention all our new drivers by name, but I have put in as many as I could, and there are still more to come later on. Den Rothwell (772) retired last autumn and has now made a come-back, while Barry Vernon has turned it up for a while. Andy Webb is back from the Antipodes and hopes to be back in the top ten again and the last we heard of Willie Cowper was that he was getting married this year and would not race any more. Just as well, in fact, because they nicked his number and gave it to a red-top, as part of their brilliant reorganisation.

Alan Russell's brother lan makes his bow today, and so does our new commentator, Maurice Jardine. The guv'nor told me I was too busy to do the commentary this year, though I have the feeling that I have been silenced by order. I wonder why!

George Griggs is still with us, so we can count on smooth running and Jack Barrick will still be found around the starting line. Young Peter Foxwell is again looking after the lap-scoring and we look forward to a lovely season.
